Creek Defenders host 30 Clean-Ups this year so far!

From Massapequa to Mastic Beach, Save The Great South Bay's Creek Defenders have organized over 30 clean-ups this year alone, engaging hundreds of volunteers along many of the 50 creeks that flow into the Bay.

Volunteers cleaned up the Massapequa Creek March 6, Amityville and Lindenhurst on May 21, and Carlls River in Babylon Village on June 12.

Creek Defenders are local stewards, people who help organize and guide their communities, lead clean-ups and implement habitat restoration projects. They unblock and unclog creeks overrun by debris and stormwater runoff directly affecting the health of the Bay. They also spread the message that our care for the Bay begins on the land, and the quality of that water entering the Bay.

"It's the Creek Defenders who volunteer in each of the 16 towns along the Bay that deserve all the credit," said Tom Kain, chairman of the Creek Defender program. "They speak with the local
